1. Call to Order – Introductions and Announcements -

2. Approval of Minutes: April 24, 2014 meeting minutes - MSP

3. Treasurer's Report: Lynn Goodrich – excluding Project Fund monies at NWM Foundation the total is \$16,191.85 – Approved - MSP

4. Sharon Natzel - Education Committee

Sharon led us through an information gathering session asking each of us to provide our ideas and thoughts on 3 topic areas. COLA communications and how we share it with our Lakes, what is COLA doing or not doing, and sharing skills and talents were the topic areas. Our input will be reviewed and we will learn the results at a future meeting.

5. Unfinished Business:

a. Sandpiper Pipeline Update (COLA Pipeline Committee) - the extended period for filing comments ended May 30, 2014, there will be hearings this fall with final decisions made in early 2015.

b. Fund Raising – Lynn Goodrich Lynn reported the COLA Garage Sale will be Friday, July 11 at the Environmental Bldg at the Fairgrounds with set up the day before, from 2-6 PM. We need your items to sell, talk it up to your individual lakes. This could turn out to be an annual event or a one time event. Also considering a bake sale, silent auctions or raffle ticket sales on specific items within the garage sale, it all depends on items that are donated.

c. COLA Presence at Lake Association Meetings – COLA reps should provide updates on COLA activities at their lake association meetings. COLA leaders are available to attend meetings as well, contact any of the Executive Board.

6. New Business:

a. 2014 watercraft Inspections/Decontamination Station - Julie Kingsley reported there are 30 inspectors working at 27 lakes. They have already done 1242 inspections. Of those, 781 were entering our lakes, from 12 States including Alaska and Rhode Island. There are 13 drain plug violations to date, a nice improvement from last year. The decontamination station is now near the County Transfer Station in Park Rapids, a sign is going up this week. It is staffed Friday evening, 4 to 8 p.m. and Saturday afternoon 12 Noon to 6 p.m., otherwise call the hot-line at 218-252-6738.

b. COLA Representative information – Deb Roger's reports that most of the information that we used to get as handouts are now on the COLA website. A flyer was distributed regarding the website.

Doug Kingsley DNR, reported a few lakes had low oxygen levels this winter that resulted in various degrees of winter kill from slight to complete kill. These results were similar to past years and restocking has been done. There appears to be a good walleye hatch this year !
