Hubbard SWCD AIS Presentation: Nate Sitz presented information to the lakes that Have watercraft inspectors. As of July 20, 2014: 8708 boats had been inspected, of which 5321 were entering. 124 had drain plugs in (last year this time 318); 88 boats had water in them (225 last year); 5 Boats sent away to drain water out; 73 boats had vegetation (last year 203); 419 boats entering from infested waters (538 boats last year); 788 boats entering from out of state (724 last year). Boats entered from 34 different states.
