Which Agency Enforces What?

- Park Rangers
 - Limited to specific State Park Violations
- Sheriff's Office


Support DNR Conservation Officers

HITCHHIKERS

To avoid spreading aquatic invasive species

BEFORE launching ... BEFORE leaving: • Remove aquatic plants and aquatic animals

Drain lake or river water away from the landing
 Dispose of unwanted live bait in the trash

It's the Law ... Do Not:

 Transport watercraft without draining water, removing the drain plug, and opening water-draining devices

 Transport aquatic plants, zebra mussels, or other prohibited species on public roads
 Launch a watercraft or place a trailer in the water if it has aquatic plants, zebra mussels, or other prohibited species attached


- Enforcement's role
 - Investigate possible suspects
 - Citations / Civil Citations / Warnings
 - Monetary to watercraft license suspension
 - Transfer information to subject matter experts






Resources the MN DNR supports / Covers
