

From The President-Sharon Natzel



Our "Eyes On The Water" Program Combats AIS

Hubbard County Coalition of Lake Associations (HC COLA) is encouraging all lakeshore owners to be your lake's "Eyes on the Water". You could be a "first responder" in locating an aquatic invasive species (AIS) on your lake. This early detection has proven to be an effective way of stemming the subsequent spread of AIS to other lakes. Early detection can also allow for more effective treatment options in your lake.

In the autumn of each year, lake associations remind their property owners to check their docks, lifts, boats / equipment for zebra mussels. HC COLA

has a short survey where you can record your findings. An "absence" report is important too. Become a "Citizen Watch Volunteer" by completing the survey. All of us at HC COLA thank you for your AIS prevention efforts!

Is Wild Rice An AIS?

In the past couple years there have been numerous inquiries from lake property owners about Wild Rice reappearing in some Minnesota DNR Northwest Region 1 lakes. Shoreland owners are not recognizing the plant and are asking what they can do to get rid of it. Most of them are wondering if it is some form of invasive species as they have not seen it in these locations in the past. Annette Drewes, DNR Clean Water Specialist & Independent Wild Rice Consultant, has prepared an article on Wild

Water Quality Analysis Reports

The Water Quality Analysis Reports for HC COLA lakes are available with an easy query of the RMB Lakes Monitoring Database. https://www.rmbel.info/data/ You can run a trend report over time for chlorophyll-a, total phosphorus and secchi disk measurements indicating clarity.

Thanks to the many HC COLA citizen lake monitoring volunteers who sample their lake in a specific location, using specific sampling methods on a specific date for each of the 5 months in open water season, May through September! The RMB Environmental Laboratories Inc analyzes these water samples after they are delivered monthly by the HC COLA volunteer cooler shuttle team. This is a team effort! The data is also provided to the MN Pollution Control Agency.
