

AIS Prevention Partnership Accomplishments 2020 and Plans for 2021


On Thursday, October 29, 2020 at 6:30 PM, 21 Hubbard County lake associations represented by 28 members and 3 guests gathered online via Zoom for the final 2020 Hubbard County Coalition of Lake Associations (HC COLA) Board Meeting. Our next HC COLA Board Meeting will be online via Zoom on Thursday, April 29, 2021 at 6:30 PM. We will use this monthly E-Newsletter to help us all continue to collaborate and stay informed during the Autumn / Winter seasons here in this Headwaters lakes area.

The focus of the October HC COLA Board Meeting was aquatic invasive species (AIS) prevention. The AIS prevention partnership recap of accomplishments for 2020 and the plans for 2021 were shared ahead of the meeting with HC COLA Representatives / Alternates plus Lake Association Presidents, volunteer AIS and Water Monitors to facilitate discussion / understanding. Nick Macklem, Hubbard County Environmental Services Department, Environmental Specialist – AIS Program and the HC COLA AIS Operating Team collaborated on the recap you'll find on the HC COLA website in communications \rightarrow committee reports

Zebra Mussel Control with Low-Dose Copper

Zebra mussels (Dreissena polymorpha) are one of the most problematic invasive species in Minnesota, causing significant ecological and economic impacts in bodies of water where they have established. EarthTec QZ is an EPA-registered proprietary formulation of copper sulfate that has been used in Minnesota for controlling dreissenid mussels in open water systems. In 2019, MAISRC and USGS researchers conducted an experimental application of low-dose copper in Lake Minnetonka. The concentration was substantially lower than previously used for adult zebra mussels in Minnesota lakes—60 parts per billion (ppb) vs. one part per million (ppm) of free copper. This 'suppression strategy' has shown promise in early-stage trials. The objectives of the study were to determine the effectiveness of low-dose copper for reducing zebra mussel recruitment and to monitor the response of native biota.

Our Lakeshore/Groundwater Connection Videos

These animated videos about lakeshore restoration and stewardship were created in collaboration with the Anoka County Water Resource Outreach Collaborative and several local Lake Associations. The videos describe lake processes and gives lakeshore owners some steps they can take to restore their shoreline and become lakeshore stewards.

In September 2020 University of MN Extension - Hubbard County and HC COLA sponsored two workshops on "Lawns & Lakes - There is a Connection" and "Shoreland Advisors 101". Recordings can be found at http://www.hubbardcolamn.org/presentations.html. The workshops were developed and taught by Karen Terry, retired from Water Resource Management, UMN Extension. Karen has also prepared curriculum and trained Shoreland Advisors in 2019 for Itasca County. The new HC COLA Shoreland Advisor complimentary program is available for lakeshore owners who may be interested in inviting a trained volunteer shoreland advisor to visit with them by walking with the landowner on their lakeshore (socially distanced / with masks), listening to the landowners ideas and sharing insights potentially for the lakeshore property owner's miniwatershed. Interested lakeshore owners reach out initially by emailing HC COLA. We will offer another Shoreland Advisor Workshop in the Spring of 2021. These animated videos show the connection between "Lawns & Lakes" so well! Enjoy!

HC COLA Supports UMN Healthy Waters Initiative

HC COLA has made an investment in the UMN St. Anthony Falls Laboratory Healthy Waters Initiative research project. The research will involve the impact of boat generated wakes and propeller wash on water bodies. This initiative focuses on conducting robust research on Minnesota's lakes and rivers. The current project is focused on studying the impacts of boat generated waves and propeller wash on lake bottoms and shorelines. The study will examine several large recreational watercraft under different usage scenarios. Research has begun on this multi-year project.

Letter from UMN

Three Hubbard County Lakes Added To DNR Infested Waters List

Three Hubbard County lakes were added to the MN DNR Infested Waters List in 2020. AIS species noted were eurasian watermilfoil, faucet snail and zebra mussel. Early detection efforts were a factor in these discoveries. Early detection helps to contain the spread of AIS through education and management action where possible. The AIS early detection techniques are part of our HC COLA "Eyes on the Water" Program, something that all lake users can be involved in.

- The hand pulling of Eurasion Watermilfoil on Big Mantrap by the MN DNR Northwest Region Invasive Species Specialist, Nicole Kovar and treatment of the EWM at the access sponsored by the Big Mantrap Lake Association and Hubbard County were focused on preventing the spread in the lake and being picked up by exiting boats / trailers too.
- For Long Lake, the decontamination station in Park Rapids was promoted plus clean-drain-dry techniques at the

kiosks, in the mailing to all lakeshore owners, in the local newspaper and through the watercraft inspector / educators to contain the spread of ZM. A fishing tournament organizer changed the order of lakes fished too to help prevent the accidental spread of ZM through residual water or on vegetation.

• Boulder Lake focused on education to prevent the spread of faucet snails and introduction of other AIS.

Water Quality Analysis Reports

The Water Quality Analysis Reports for HC COLA lakes are available with an easy query of the <u>RMB Lakes Monitoring Database</u>. You can run a trend report over time for chlorophyll-a, total phosphorus and secchi disk measurements indicating clarity.

Thanks to the many HC COLA citizen lake monitoring volunteers who sample their lake in a specific location, using specific sampling methods on a specific date for each of the 5 months in open water season, May through September! The RMB Environmental Laboratories Inc analyzes these water samples after they are delivered monthly by the HC COLA volunteer cooler shuttle team. This is a team effort! The data is also provided to the MN Pollution Control Agency.
